Health Requirements for Domestic Animals
at Fairs, and Livestock Exhibitions

1. Cattle from all counties may show without Brucellosis or Tuberculin test prior to showing, providing the herd is not under quarantine.
2. Domestic animals offered for show or exhibition at any fair, or livestock, or poultry show, or exhibition showing evidence of external parasites, foot rot, shipping fever, or other diseases may be excluded from, ordered removed, or otherwise handled as the Directors of the Division of Animal Industry may direct.
3. All domestic animals originating outside the State must meet the same requirements to show as are required for entry into the State.
4. Warts will be classified as an infectious disease.
5. The owner of any animal will be accountable for any damage such animal may do, as well as for the animal's safekeeping.
6. State veterinarians and other officials shall have the right to examine all animals on the grounds for infection, diseases or drugs, etc., at any time.
7. Bedding will be supplied by the exhibitor.
8. No more than two monies paid in any one class.
9. Bulls 12 months or older must use a nose lead or ring when being shown.
10. Entry blanks for livestock are located in this book on page 6.
11. **Proof of insurance is required on all animals at Topsham Fair.**

No dairy or beef cattle are to leave the grounds before 4:00 pm on Sunday without the permission

of the Supt. of the Livestock Department. Please refer to the rules and regulations listed at the beginning of the book.

No dogs allowed on Topsham Fairground property except service dogs.

4-H Club Exhibit Requirements

1. All Clubs will display their projects as a club unit in a space assigned to the club.
2. Clubs are urged to use their members’ projects as their major display items.
3. Other decorations may be used to enhance the overall appearance of the club display (crepe paper, streamers, dried flowers, etc.)

The club sign (not made of cardboard or paper) must prominently include its club name and city or town for the public to see.

The club exhibits will be judged as follows:

50 Points) for overall appearance of the club members’ individual projects in the space provided.

25 Points) for overall appearance of the decorated space.

15 Points) for community service project and/or educational exhibit

10 Points) for the name and address of the club (appearance and execution)
